

IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

To reduce the risk of electric shock, do not remove cover. No user serviceable parts inside. Refer servicing to qualified personnel. The unit should be operated in a well ventilated area. Minimum clearance is 2 inches from the ventilation openings.



Controls and Functions

Front Panel



1. POWER SWITCH

Turns the device on and off.

2. POWER INDICATOR

The ring surrounding the power switch will illuminate amber when the unit is turned on.

3. VU METERS

Indicates the audio output level of the left and right channels.

4. BASS CONTROL

Adjusts the volume level for the bass output.

5. TREBLE CONTROL

Adjusts the volume level for the treble output.

6. HEADPHONE OUTPUT

The headphone output allows you to listen to any input privately without playing audio through your speakers. The output accepts ¹/₄" TRS headphone connectors. Plugging in headphones here will cut off the signal to the speakers and SW OUT [10].

NOTE: To avoid accidental damage to your headphones or speakers always turn down the volume before connecting or disconnecting headphones.

7. VOLUME CONTROL


Turn this up to begin experiencing the warm natural tone generated by the tube preamplifier.

8. SOURCE INPUT SELECTOR

Press the corresponding input button to select the desired source. The corresponding light will illuminate when the input is selected.

NOTE: PC-USB input will not be selectable unless there is a device connected to the unit and powered on.

9. DIGITAL (OPTICAL) INPUT

10. SUBWOOFER OUTPUT

Use a single RCA cable to connect the SW OUT to a powered subwoofer or separate subwoofer amplifier.

This will output a full range mono signal and the volume output will change depending on the position of the front panel volume control.

NOTE: The output will signal will be interrupted when headphones are connected on the front of the amplifier.

11. BLUETOOTH ANTENNA

Connect the supplied Bluetooth antenna here for optimum signal strength.

12. GROUND TERMINAL

13. AC VOLTAGE SELECTOR SWITCH

The unit is set at the factory for 110V operation. For 220V operation, move the voltage selector switch to the 220V position. When operating at 220V the internal fuse located in the IEC socket should also be changed. In most 220V applications a separate power cord will be required and is not included.

18. SPEAKER OUTPUTS

Using insulated 2 conductor wire to connect to speakers. The polarity, positive (+), and negative (-) for all speaker and amplifier connections must be consistent so both the left and right speakers are in phase.


NOTE: The speaker outputs are not bridgeable.

Connections

Connecting the Power Cable

Before connecting the main power cable, make sure that the voltage selector switch is set according to your local voltage. Incorrect setting of the voltage selector switch could cause damage to the amplifier and has a potential risk of fire.




Connecting Speakers

The amplifier can power speakers with a minimum impedance of 4Ω . Using high quality two conductor speaker wire connect your speakers to the binding posts on the rear of the unit.


Connect the HTA100's left speaker terminals marked "L-" and "L+" to the corresponding "-" and "+" terminals on your left speaker. Repeat the same process for the right channel.

Note: Never connect the negative terminals together or to ground. The HTA100 is not designed to operate in a bridged mode and attempting to do so may damage the amplifier.




Connecting Banana Plug Cables

- 1. Tighten the knob.
- 2. Insert the banana plug terminated cable into the end of the corresponding terminal.



Connecting Speaker Wires

- Strip about 3/8" of insulation from the end of each speaker wire and twist the bare wires of the cable together.
- 2. Unscrew the knob before inserting the bare wire into the hole in the side of each terminal before tightening the knob to secure the wire.



Connecting A Subwoofer


If you really want to feel the bass or just want to bother the neighbors you can add a subwoofer using the SW OUT connection on the rear of the HTA100. This signal is full range and will send a mono summed signal that is controllable by the front volume knob. Using a single RCA cable you can connect to the line level input on a powered subwoofer or to any external subwoofer amplifier to power passive subwoofers.

Connecting Headphones

Headphones can be connected to the ¹/₄" TRS connection on the front of the HTA100. This is great for listening to any source and enjoying the classic warmth from the tube preamps. Plugging in headphones will stop any signal from being output to the speaker output terminals or SW OUT.

Note: To avoid damage to headphones or your hearing make sure to turn down the volume before plugging in your headphones. Always turn down the volume knob before unplugging headphones to avoid accidental output to your speakers or startling any cats napping nearby.

Connecting Sources



The HTA100 is capable of receiving signals directly from a wide variety of sources. Using high quality cables will ensure the best possible transmission from your connected devices.

Connecting a Turntable

The HTA100 is capable of connecting directly to most turntables without the addition of an external phono preamplifier.

- 1. Ensure that your turntable is set to output a phono signal. Many modern turntables have the ability to output either a line level signal or a phono signal. If your turntable is set to output a line level signal please connect it to the AUX input on the HTA100.
- 2. Remove the covers from the PHONO RCA plugs and connect the turntable to the phono input.
- 3. Connect the ground wire of the turntable to the ground terminal on the rear of the HTA100 (if applicable).

Bluetooth as a Source

- 1. Connect the Bluetooth antenna to the BTANTENNA port on the rear of the unit. Also make sure that the Bluetooth input is selected on the HTA100.
- 2. Using a smart phone, tablet, computer, or other device capable of transmitting Bluetooth audio, go the devices settings and scan for available Bluetooth devices.
- 3. Look for and select "HTA100" in the device list and begin pairing. The Bluetooth source light on the HTA100 will flash until a device is paired.
- 4. Once the Bluetooth source light stops flashing and your device indicates that you are connected you can begin streaming your favorite music from up to 30 feet away.

Troubleshooting

Problem	Cause	Solution
The unit fails to turn on	The power cable is not connected properly	Check to make sure both ends of the power cable are connected properly.
	Incorrect voltage selection switch setting	Verify that the voltage selection switch is set according the region and power standard in your country.
	Protection circuit has been activated	Turn the amplifier off and check that your speaker wires are not shorting out. If this problem persists please contact Dayton Audio for customer support.
The unit turns off suddenly	There is a short in the connected speaker wire.	Examine the speaker wire for any damage. Do not use any cable that has exposed wire.
	Speaker malfunctioning	Disconnect the speakers one at a time to see if the issue is caused by the speakers or the amplifier. If the problem persists with all speakers please contact Dayton Audio customer support.
No sound	Correct input has not been selected	Verify that the correct input is selected.
	Headphones are connected	Unplug the headphones from the front panel. Audio should resume in the connected speakers.
	Incorrect cable connections	Double check that the device that you are trying to listen to is connected to the correct input.
Low volume	Volume on the playback device is turned down	Verify that any volume control on your phone, computer, or connected playback device is turned up.
The sound output lacks bass	The speakers polarity is reversed	Double check the speaker connections, ensuring that the + and - terminals are connected properly on both speakers. (p.6)
	The bass knob is turned down	Ensure that the "BASS" control knob is not turned down all the way.
There is a "humming sound"	No ground connection from the amplifier to the turntable	Make sure that the GND connection is made between the turntable and the amplifier.
The turntable is distorted	The turntable is set to line output but is connected to the PHONO input	Verify that if your turntable is uning a line out signal that it is connected to the AUX input on the amplifier. If the turntable is outputting a phono signal verify that it is connected to the PHONO input.
	The phono connection is improperly grounded	Make sure that there is a connection between the grounding terminals on the amplifier and the turntable.
